Developed with methodological rigor, transparency, and a focus on tangible results, the report represents a key step in articulating Italdesign's identity, operating model, and the impacts generated for both internal and external stakeholders.

"We are truly proud to present our first ESG report," comments Antonio Casu, Italdesign CEO. *"It is not a simple collection of data, but the narrative of a journey that reflects our commitment to making sustainability an integral part of how we operate and who we are. It is a document that embodies transparency towards everyone who shares our journey — from collaborators to clients, from partners to the global community,"* he concludes.

"We are committed to promoting broad and cross-cutting responsibility that embraces environmental, social, and governance dimensions," says Ismene Lage Canellas, ESG Officer at Italdesign. *"This report*

is an important first step — not a finish line, but a living tool designed to evolve over time and respond to global developments and stakeholder expectations. The data collected provides a clear snapshot of 2023 and lays the foundation for increasingly integrated and strategic reporting.”

She adds: *“Our roadmap includes the publication of our second report by the end of this year, covering the fiscal year ending December 31, 2024.”*

The report stands out for its early adoption of the new European Sustainability Reporting Standards (ESRS) and guides the reader through the three ESG pillars: environmental, social, and governance. From the company’s heritage to its future projections, - including double materiality analysis, positive impact-driven initiatives, real-time energy dashboards, and the integration of ESG criteria into business processes - the report outlines a concrete and measurable path.

Key achievements include:

- Launch of the first sustainability strategy, with the establishment of ESG governance, roles, responsibilities, and dedicated processes.
- Completion of the first double materiality assessment and identification of strategic topics.
- 18 positive-impact initiatives carried out with the involvement of 20 local and social entities.
- Over 30,000 euros allocated to solidarity sponsorships and donations, aligned with circular economy principles.
- Integration of ESG criteria in corporate processes, tenders, and supply chain management.
- Implementation of real-time energy dashboards for consumption monitoring.
- Definition of medium-term ESG targets based on measurable metrics and aligned with key sectoral and environmental benchmarks, with a focus on decarbonization and climate resilience. These targets will be formalized in the second report, due by the end of 2025 and referring to fiscal year 2024.

“ESG, our choice has inspired our entire journey,” concludes Ismene Lage Canellas. “It is not an obligation, but a conscious decision: we want sustainability to become an integral part of how we think and act, across every function and process of our organization.”
